Two points of view on Abdur'Rahman

With death row inmate Abu-Ali Abdur'Rahman facing a June 18 execution in connection with a 1986 murder, the U.S. Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals Friday stayed that execution pending a hearing by the full court.
