Hit and run suspect released on bond

The man police believe was driving a truck that struck Carrie Holmes, 22, as she walked along Bell Road on Labor Day surrendered Tuesday afternoon at the Criminal Justice Center. Holmes died five days after the accident.

Jason Guy, 35, was brought in by his attorney, David Raybin. He was released on \$100,000 bond.

Metro police Fatal Crash investigators believe Guy was behind the wheel of a Nissan pickup that struck Holmes near her apartment complex in the 3500 block of Bell Road that evening.

Guy faces a multi-count grand jury indictment — vehicular homicide by intoxication, vehicular homicide by recklessness and leaving the scene of a fatal crash.

Immediately after the crash, a man who said he was a passenger in the pickup truck that struck Holmes returned to the scene and told police that Guy was the driver.

He reported that he told Guy to stop but that Guy refused. The passenger also told investigators he and Guy had been drinking before the crash.

Guy contacted police the morning after the accident saying he heard news reports that a woman had been struck in the area where he had been driving.

Fatal Crash officers are also investigating whether Guy was text messaging at the time of the collision
